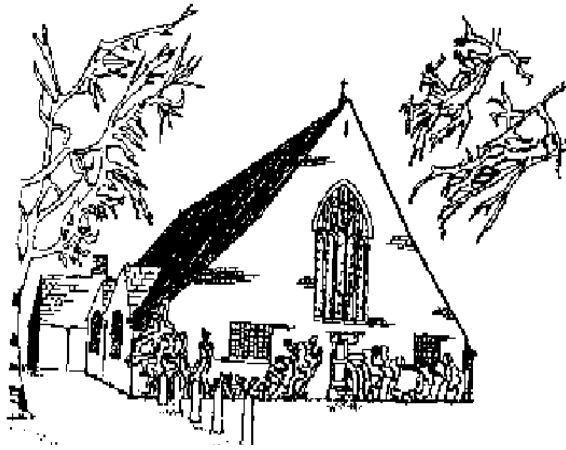

The Parish was founded in December 1937 when the first Minister was appointed and held services in the dining room of his house in 80 Borough Way – 9 people attended the Christmas Eucharist that year. Later the worshippers met in his garage and then in the Hall-cum-Church built near the corner of Mutton Lane and Dugdale Hill Lane. It was during the Second World War that the Church was built in the style of a Jacobean barn. Funded partly by the Diocese of London and partly by the Royal Martyr Church Union, the Church was consecrated on 12<sup>th</sup> July 1941. In 2003, the Church Hall was ‘added on’ and then a year later the new Vicarage was finished, so that all our buildings are now on one site.

During the past decades, the Church has firmly established itself in the life of the local community and has a lively and active membership which enjoys a wide variety of styles of worship.

### **SUNDAYS – Two main services**

#### **9.15am Sung Eucharist**, *for one hour*

– A traditional Communion Service with music led by our Choir.

#### **11.0am Morning Worship**, *for one hour*

– A more informal Service, with music led by our Music Group.

*There’s a room for babies to play in*

*2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday – Communion for all at 11am, when everyone stays in Church*
