If you are joining us in person the words you need to take part in our services will be on the screen or you will be given a booklet – this is yours please take it away with you and bring it back when you return. Don't forget next weekend to turn your clock back one hour on Sunday 25 October.

From November

We will return to one service at 1030 on a Sunday morning.

The proposal from the PCC meeting 29 September 2020 was that we keep a pattern of one Sunday morning service at a regular time during this winter period and offer our two styles of services on alternate Sunday's with the fifth Sunday being a joint service.

1030 each Sunday alternating the style of worship

- 1st and 3rd Morning Worship Eucharist
- 2nd and 4th Sung Eucharist with the choir and organ
- 5th Sunday's will be a joint service of Holy communion

All are welcome to any service.

There are some changes to our worship due to the Coronavirus pandemic: please read the guidance below carefully.

Coronavirus precautions

We want you to feel safe and comfortable worshipping here, so we have put some precautions in place, following advice from the Government and the Church of England Authorities. Please follow these for the wellbeing of all our worshippers and visitors.

- **Please keep at least 2 meters** wherever possible from people with whom you do not live, and only sit adjacent to other members of your household, **leaving 3 seats** between you and the next household.
- Unless you have an exemption **face coverings must be worn in church**, with some exceptions for those with a role in liturgy.
- Please remove your face covering and sanitise your hands before coming forward for communion.
- Please **sanitise your hands** when you arrive in church and when you leave. If you use the toilet, please wash your hands thoroughly afterwards.
- Please **sign in** and make use of the **QR code** to scan in on the NHS App when coming to either the halls or church
- We are not taking a **collection** during our services. **We very much need and value your support**, if you wish to make a contribution to the life and mission of this church please leave it in the plate at the back, use our contactless machine or donate via the button on our website.
- **Holy Communion** will be given in one kind only (the host- bread) and will be given into your hands. Please remove your mask and keep social distance from the person in front of you when the steward directs you forward to receive and return to your seat by the side aisle.
- If there is to be a second service in the church on the day that you attend **please leave a kneeler on your seat**, this is to place the seat out of use for the next service.

Like everyone, we are learning as we go and we welcome constructive comments: if you have any particular concerns, or suggestions, please so speak to the priest or church wardens who will be happy to help you.

O God, forasmuch as without you
we are not able to please you;
mercifully grant that your Holy Spirit
may in all things direct and rule our hearts;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Isaiah 45.1–7

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:
Grace to you and peace.

² We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly ³ remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴ For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, ⁵ because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of people we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶ And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, ⁷ so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸ For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place where your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. ⁹ For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, ¹⁰ and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

¹⁵ Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. ¹⁶ So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, ‘Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. ¹⁷ Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?’ ¹⁸ But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, ‘Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? ¹⁹ Show me the coin used for the tax.’ And they brought him a denarius. ²⁰ Then he said to them, ‘Whose head is this, and whose title?’ ²¹ They

answered, 'The emperor's.' Then he said to them, 'Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's.' ²² When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.
