Collect

God our redeemer,
you have delivered us from the power of darkness
and brought us into the kingdom of your Son:
grant, that as by his death he has recalled us to life,
so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Acts 10. 44- end

⁴⁴ While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message. ⁴⁵ The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on Gentiles. ⁴⁶ For they heard them speaking in tongues and praising God.
Then Peter said, ⁴⁷ “Surely no one can stand in the way of their being baptized with water. They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have.” ⁴⁸ So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days.

1 John 5.1–6

5 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ² By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³ For the love of God is this,

that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴ for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵ Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

⁶ This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

¹² 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶ You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷ I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Churches Together Holiday Club – postponed until 2022.

Sadly, due to lack of volunteers we have decided to postpone the holiday club until 2022 so that we can run it safely and with the numbers of children that we would like to welcome. Please do continue to pray for all the families associated with the holiday club, all those who will be disappointed and those who have already put great effort into planning. Nothing will be lost the work that we have done this year can be used again next year.

Help needed to support our young people. Over the coming months we are going to run another Communion before confirmation class, and preparation for confirmation for those at secondary school. To enable us to do this safely and well, we need your support so that the Children and Families worker and Vicar are not solely tied up with this. We will run sessions after church on Sunday mornings for about 45mins. Could you help teach our young people? Could you pray with them and walk along side them as they make these steps on their faith journey? Training will be given and the material is all prepared. If you could like to support our youth in this way, please speak to Revd. Atalie

Sunday mornings children's group. For a trial period the children are invited to go straight to the hall on a Sunday morning for their group, and then return for communion. This will give them a longer session for teaching and learning, and we hope that they will come and tell us what they have been doing towards the end of the service.

Baptism Welcomers. I am looking to recruit a couple of people to be baptism welcomers. These will be people who will make contact with Baptism families before the service, will welcome them and their families on the day of their baptism and keep in touch with them afterwards to let them know about activities that are happening in the church. All you need is a friendly disposition and a love of children, and you will be making a really positive connection between our church family and theirs.
