### **Collect**

O God, forasmuch as without you  
we are not able to please you;  
mercifully grant that your Holy Spirit  
may in all things direct and rule our hearts;  
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,  
who is alive and reigns with you,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, now and for ever.

### **Job 23.1-9,16-end**

23 Then Job answered:

2 'Today also my complaint is bitter;  
his hand is heavy despite my groaning.

3 O that I knew where I might find him,  
that I might come even to his dwelling!

- 4 I would lay my case before him,  
and fill my mouth with arguments.
- 5 I would learn what he would answer me,  
and understand what he would say to me.
- 6 Would he contend with me in the greatness of his power?  
No; but he would give heed to me.
- 7 There an upright person could reason with him,  
and I should be acquitted for ever by my judge.
- 8 'If I go forward, he is not there;  
or backward, I cannot perceive him;
- 9 on the left he hides, and I cannot behold him;  
I turn to the right, but I cannot see him.

### **Psalm 22.1-15**

- 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me,  
and are so far from my salvation,  
from the words of my distress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime,  
but you do not answer;  
and by night also, but I find no rest.
- 3 Yet you are the Holy One,  
enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- 4 Our forebears trusted in you;  
they trusted, and you delivered them.
- 5 They cried out to you and were delivered;  
they put their trust in you and were not confounded.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm and no man,  
scorned by all and despised by the people.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn;  
they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 'He trusted in the Lord; let him deliver him;  
let him deliver him, if he delights in him.'
- 9 But it is you that took me out of the womb  
and laid me safe upon my mother's breast.
- 10 On you was I cast ever since I was born;

you are my God even from my mother's womb.  
11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near at hand  
and there is none to help.  
12 Mighty oxen come around me;  
fat bulls of Bashan close me in on every side.  
13 They gape upon me with their mouths,  
as it were a ramping and a roaring lion.  
14 I am poured out like water;  
all my bones are out of joint;  
my heart has become like wax  
melting in the depths of my body.  
15 My mouth is dried up like a potsherd;  
my tongue cleaves to my gums;  
you have laid me in the dust of death.

### **Hebrews 4.12-end**

I Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. <sup>3</sup> He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, <sup>4</sup> having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. Exaltation through Abasement <sup>5</sup> Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. <sup>6</sup> But someone has testified somewhere, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them?" <sup>7</sup> You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, <sup>8</sup> subjecting all things under their feet." Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, <sup>9</sup> but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. <sup>11</sup> For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, saying, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."

## **Mark 10.17–31**

17 As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, ‘Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?’ 18 Jesus said to him, ‘Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. 19 You know the commandments: “You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother.” ’ 20 He said to him, ‘Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.’ 21 Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, ‘You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.’ 22 When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

23 Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, ‘How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!’ 24 And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, ‘Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! 25 It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.’ 26 They were greatly astounded and said to one another, ‘Then who can be saved?’ 27 Jesus looked at them and said, ‘For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.’

28 Peter began to say to him, ‘Look, we have left everything and followed you.’ 29 Jesus said, ‘Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, 30 who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. 31 But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.’

**Appointment of Academy Directors.** The Diocesan Board of Education is seeking to identify a small number of new Directors to take part in the work of one of its stand-alone academies in the south west of Bedfordshire. This is an



opportunity to support the governance of an academy serving an area of significant deprivation as it emerges from the COVID pandemic and continues to strive to meet the needs of all its pupils. Expertise in SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) and safeguarding are particularly required, but general educational or business experience would also be valued. Directors play a full role in the life of the Academy, and visits to the school to meet staff and pupils are strongly encouraged.

These appointments are under the responsibility of the Diocesan Board of Education, making it important that prospective Directors are capable of wholly supporting and promoting the development of the Christian character of the Academy and its unique Christian vision for the community it serves.

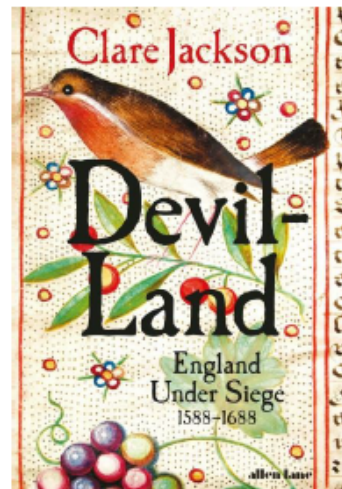
The Royal Stuart Society is very pleased to announce a lecture by the distinguished academic and broadcaster **Dr Clare Jackson** who will deliver a lecture on her forthcoming book "**Devil-Land, England Under Siege 1588-1688**"

Dr Jackson is Senior Tutor at Trinity Hall Cambridge and a Lecturer in the Cambridge History Faculty. She is the author of several books, including one on Charles II, and one on the Restoration in Scotland. Her research interests include the history of ideas in early modern Britain, especially 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> century Scotland; concepts of kingship, law and sovereignty in early modern Scotland; and the politics of multiple monarchy in seventeenth century Britain.

Dr Jackson is best known for her television programmes which include the three-part series **The Stuarts**, and the two-part series **The Stuarts in Exile** for BBC 2.

**Devil-Land, England Under Siege 1588-1688** looks in on England during this period through the eyes of foreign observers.

Dr Jackson portrays a diabolical country of fallen angels torn apart by seditious rebellion, religious extremism and royal collapse. This dazzling and original account of England's most turbulent and radical era tells the story of a nation in a state of near continual crisis, culminating in the not-so "Glorious Revolution" a hundred years later. We look forward to a stimulating lecture.
