## Musings from the vicarage



Our gospel reading this week can be interpreted as being all about saying thank you and we all know that saying thank you is very powerful. Often in our British culture when people thank us, we respond with comments such as — 'don't mention it', 'it was nothing', 'anyone would have done it', all of which

take something away from the thank you.

I have now been with you for a month, and I want to say a heartfelt thank you for making me so welcome and for letting me become a part of so much of what you are doing. It has meant so much to me to just be accepted as me. And it has also been very humbling when many of you have thanked me for being willing to listen to God's call and come here. I think this month I have experienced, and perhaps for the first time really understood, what David Whyte in his book 'Consolations', describes as true thankfulness when 'our sense of presence meets all other presences' because thankfulness 'finds its full measure in generosity of presence, both through participation and witness'.

As a church and as individuals, we have so much to be thankful for, and the season of harvest is a good reminder, in the words of one of my favourite Autumn songs that, 'we mustn't forget, no we mustn't forget, to say a great big thank you, no we mustn't forget'.

And so, I say it again – **thank you** for making me so welcome and **thank you** God for bringing me to KCM for such a time as this and I encourage you, to 'come ye thankful people, come' and give God all the glory.

#### **New Archbishop of Canterbury**

Wasn't it exciting last Friday when we heard the announcement that the Bishop of London, the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally DBE, has been nominated as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury. I am sure we all offer her our warm congratulations and look forward to working with her in this new

ministry, as together we continue to serve Christ and his church. She will be installed at Canterbury Cathedral in March 2026, following her Confirmation of Election at St Paul's Cathedral in January.

Bishop Sarah's response to the announcement I think shows her servant heart and I am sure this is something which was noted by the appointment committee:

"As I respond to the call of Christ to this new ministry, I do so in the same spirit of service to God and to others that has motivated me since I first came to faith as a teenager. At every stage of that journey, through my nursing career and Christian ministry, I have learned to listen deeply – to people and to God's gentle prompting – to seek to bring people together to find hope and healing.



I want, very simply, to encourage the Church to continue to grow in confidence in the Gospel, to speak of the love that we find in Jesus Christ and for it to shape our actions. And I look forward to sharing this journey of faith with the millions of people serving God and their communities in parishes all over the country and across the global Anglican Communion. I know this is a huge responsibility, but I approach it with a sense of peace and trust in God to carry me as He always has."

As we mark this moment, we are encouraged to offer the following prayer: *Gracious God*,

We give thanks for the appointment of Bishop Sarah Mullally as the next Archbishop of Canterbury.

Recognising the weight of the ministry she will undertake, we ask that you strengthen and guide her in all things.

We pray also for the Diocese of London,

as they prepare for the change and transition that her departure will bring. May she be upheld by your grace and surrounded by the prayers of your people, as she leads with wisdom, courage and compassion.

Amen.
