Musings from the vicarage

Do you ever have weeks where lots of things come together, and it feels as if God is trying to tell you something? Well, I have had one of those weeks and so I thought I would share it with you!

As you know, Advent begins this Sunday and it a time when we prepare, not just for the perfect Christmas day with all the trimmings, but for the coming of Jesus both as a baby and when he comes again in glory.



As I was preparing for our communion service on Tuesday, I found that it was the day in the church calendar when we remembered Isaac Watts, the great hymn writer. I am sure we all have favourite hymns written by him, one of mine being the Christmas carol, Joy to the World. However, something I read, challenged me to think about it as an Advent carol, because it contains one of the most powerful lines of Advent preparation ever written, 'Let every heart prepare Him room'. I was challenged to consider where in

my life I needed to make room for Jesus this Advent because isn't that what advent is about, making room – room for Jesus?

Then on Tuesday evening, this challenge was further reinforced when I went to a Churches Together meeting. Adrian, the Baptist minister, read Psalm 43 which contains that beautiful verse, 'Be still and know that I am God', but in the version he read, it said, 'Let go and know that I am God'. I was struck, that making room in our hearts often means letting go of those things that we hold tightly too and that in preparing for Christ's coming there maybe things that I need to let go of so that when he comes, I recognise him, and know that he is God.

That first Christmas, so many of the characters had to let go of the familiar to look for a baby, which the 90 children from Cranborne School, who have been in church this week, did when they went on a Jesus hunt as we retold the Christmas story. As I heard them joining in with the words, "We're going to find a baby, a very special baby, it's a beautiful day, we're not scared", it struck me that letting go and preparing our hearts for Christmas isn't



scary, it's exciting as it means that we will be ready on Christmas day to find and welcome Jesus.

So this Advent, let's let go and prepare room in our worship, in our homes and most of all in the secret places of our hearts, so that when we sing Joy to the World on Christmas morning, our joy is complete and we can say, in the words of the hymn that we sang last Sunday (which incidentally wasn't written by Isaac Watts), 'Come to my heart, Lord Jesus, there is room in my heart for Thee'. **Revd Emma**

SUMMER HOLIDAY CLUB - VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION

During the summer of 2024 the churches in Potters Bar ran a holiday club for children of primary school age in Potters Bar at Pope Paul School. Adult volunteers were joined by teenage helpers and the children had a fantastic time doing art and crafts, games, drama and music.

During 2026 we hope for the Holiday Club to run from 27th – 31st July inclusive at King Charles the Martyr Church and Halls on Mutton Lane. We will continue to work with Scripture Union to aid the facilitation of the Holiday Club, but will be using resources from 'Faith In Kids' with the theme 'Shipwrecked', based on the story of Jonah. We hope for registration for families to open in May 2026, but **this can only go ahead with sufficient volunteers**. If you cannot make the whole week you can still volunteer for some of the days.

Can you help with art and crafts, games, drama, music, catering or administration? Could you lead a team of young people going from activity to activity? Full training is given and the sessions are led by experienced volunteers. PLEASE REGISTER NOW.
