## Musings from the vicarage

Over our life time we all make many journeys. Some we make every day, some we only make once and some have real significance and can be lifechanging. Journeys have been part of everyday life since time began, and the Bible is full of them. In religious circles, journeys are often called pilgrimages. Pilgrimages are journeys which are made with a specific purpose, and usually to a holy place where often personal transformation takes place before the pilgrim returns to their daily life.

This week, I feel as if I have been on two pilgrimages!

On Saturday I joined with other members of our Deanery at our Walsingham day, which was a virtual pilgrimage to the shrine of our Lady at Walsingham. We started the day with a solemn mass in which Revd Lousie from Elstree and Borehamwood, preached on the journeys that Mary took in her life time, focussing particularly on the journey to stay with her cousin Elizabeth, when she had been visited by the angels, which led to her being called 'Blessed among women' and to her singing the song which we now know as the Magnificat.

As part of the day, we were invited to come to the front where a priest prayed with us, laid hands on us and anointed us with oil before we sipped water from the Walsingham well. At this point, I was able to bring before God all those who are on our prayer list and ask that he might touch them and renew them in body, mind and spirit. This was followed by a procession around the church, following the reserved sacrament, which was carried in Monstrance, before Father Tom, our hospital chaplain, offered the Benediction. It was a great experience, and I hope that next year some of you will come with me to experience it.



And then on Tuesday, as you know, a band of KCM pilgrims set off for Edinburgh to join in the Choral Eucharist which was commemorating the martyrdom of King Charles I at St Mary's Episcopal Cathedral that evening. This was another amazing experience, and using the 1637 liturgy brought the eucharist alive in a very different way to usual. None of us came away unchanged, and I am sure that it is something that pilgrims from KCM will repeat in future years. If you want to find out more about it, talk to one of the pilgrims!



On Saturday, we all can join a pilgrimage to the Priory Church of St Bartholomew the Great, West Smithfield EC1A 9DS for another commemorative service remembering the sacrifice of his life that King Charles I because of his faith. It's not too late for you to join this one!

All of us who have been baptised are on a daily pilgrimage as we journey through life, meaning that we don't have to go to particular places to meet with God and be transformed – it can happen anywhere. All we need to be is open to the guiding of the Holy Spirit and allow God to meet us in the ordinariness of our everyday lives, daily transforming us and making us more like him, until the day when we meet him face to face. May we, this week, in the words of John Bunyan, 'labour night and day to be a pilgrim'.

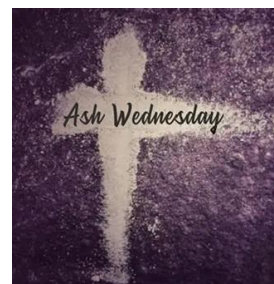
