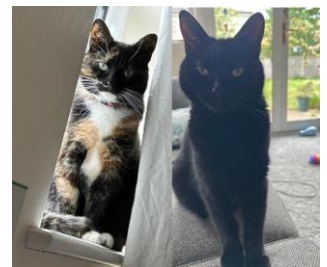

Robert is also looking for someone who might be interested in shadowing him, and eventually taking over, as our Children's Society Rep. He assures me it isn't an onerous task, so please speak to him if you might be interested.

Across Palestine and Israel, communities are living through devastating violence, loss and injustice. Palestinian Christians have called on the global Church to respond not with silence or despair, but with courage, compassion, and action. Churches and Christian organisations across the UK have come together and formed the Just Peace Coalition to respond to that call. They have launched a



campaign, “**Time to Act**”, so that by uniting together, we can amplify our message, acting with conviction, clarity and compassion and increase pressure on the UK government to take further action. Please visit the website [Home - Just Peace Coalition](#) where you can add your name to the campaign and find some initial actions that we and our church can take, including a template for

writing to our MP. Most Revd Stephen Cottrell, Archbishop of York, says, “*Time to Act provides us with the opportunity to come together as Christians and to advocate for a just peace in Israel and Palestine ...I encourage all Christians to join this campaign.*”

Musings from the Vicarage

This week our new PCC has met for the first time and our Church Warden, Bill, has been officially admitted by the Archdeacon to the role for this coming year and so I thought it might be useful in my musing to share something of the commitment they are making.

On Monday, Bill, along with a good contingent from KCM, attended a service at Christ Church Ware, where Archdeacon Janet, admitted all the churchwardens who were there to the role. This is what Bill promised as he was admitted to the role:

I do solemnly and sincerely declare that I will faithfully and diligently execute the office of Churchwarden for my parish for the year of appointment and will present such persons and things as to my knowledge and belief are presentable by the ecclesiastical laws of this realm.



He also agreed, with the help of God, to care for the church of our parish, its grounds and contents; to care for God's people and to have special care for the clergy and their families; to work with the Bishop, clergy, other ministers, the PCC and all the people of God of the parish in promoting the whole mission of the church, living God's love with generosity and joy, imagination and courage; and to fashion his own life according to the Gospel of Christ, being faithful in personal prayer and public worship.

This is no mean task and so as a church we are asked to support and enable the ministry of our new churchwarden to flourish within our Parish, and on your behalf, the 10 of us who were there to support Bill, resoundingly said, we will.

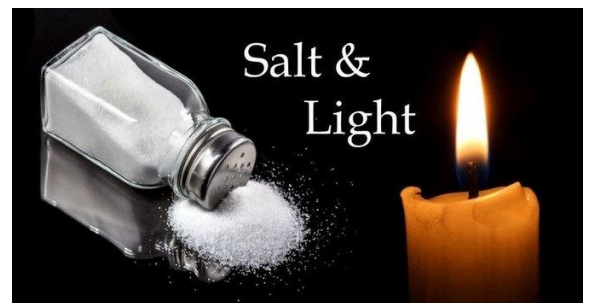
At our PCC meeting on Wednesday, we began with a commissioning liturgy during which all the PCC members were asked a series of questions:

- Will you co-operate with me, the incumbent in promoting in the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical?
- Will you commit yourselves to this work and responsibility?

- Will you seek to fulfil your responsibilities with generosity and faithfulness?

Again, they responded to these with the words, 'With the help of God, we will.' If you had all been there, I would have asked you: Brothers and sisters, will you support those on the PCC in this ministry amongst us? To which I hope you would all have answered we will, because it is so important that as a church we all support those who have put themselves forward to share in the leadership of the mission and ministry of KCM. I challenge us all to regularly pray for all the PCC members, and as a reminder to do so, at the back of church there are some prayer cards which you can pick up and take home, put on the fridge or in your bible or prayer book so that you can pray for individual members regularly.

At the service on Monday, Archdeacon Janet reminded us that we told by Jesus that we are salt and light and therefore ALL have a responsibility to flavour and illuminate the community in which we live and we all have a part to play in God's mission to the world.



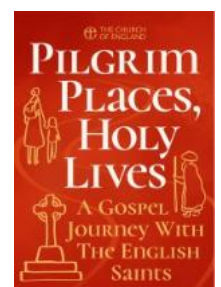

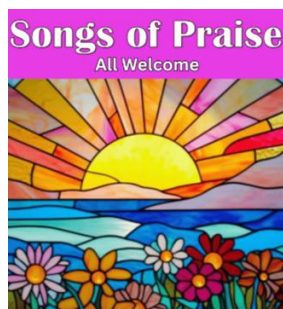

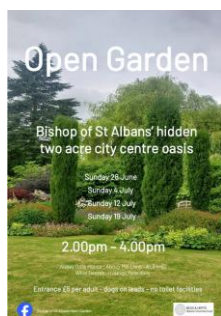
